


We look forward to receiving families to school on Friday, 10 December 2021 for report card picking and Parent-Teacher Conferences.



Human Rights Day



Human Rights Day is an international celebration of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. The United Nations (UN) adopted the declaration on December 10, 1948. The document describes the basic rights of every human, such as the right to live freely and safely. The UN recognizes Human Rights Day every year on December 10. This year's theme is "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights."

The UN helps to organize events to mark Human Rights Day around the world. Many countries hold cultural performances. People attend talks and meetings about human rights. The UN also may award a prize to people or groups that have promoted human rights.

Environmental Changes



What are environmental changes?

Environmental changes are disturbances of the environment often as a result of human activity, natural processes or animal interaction.

Human activity that involves the combustion of fossil fuels can bring about atmospheric pollution, which leads to greenhouse gasses getting trapped in the atmosphere. This can amplify the greenhouse effect which has a negative impact on the living organisms on the earth. Therefore this type of activity brings about negative environmental change.

The cleaning of the polluted environment for example; cleaning a lake can help marine life, removing plastic can increase the light that reaches the marine plants which would result in a more oxygen rich environment that is favourable for a wider variety of species ultimately increasing biodiversity which is a positive environmental change.

The animals can also bring about negative environmental change. Animal agriculture is one of the largest contributors to methane released in the atmosphere. This is one of the greenhouse gases that contribute to climate change which is ultimately a negative environmental change.

Animals positively affect the environment by dispersing seeds and the process of pollination, this helps the new growth of plants which could serve a purpose of creating a new habitat or a food source.

As shown above we are all affected by environmental changes and also have a hand in inflicting either positive or negative change.

This begs the question: What are we doing as global citizens to positively change our environment?
